This event shall support stakeholders in the cocoa sector to gain a better understanding of how child labour and its root causes have been and can be addressed through landscape approaches. The discussions throughout the day will revolve around financing mechanisms, the monitoring of child labour, and the interlinkage between mHRDD and child labour components in landscape approaches while differentiating between specific child labour-focused area-based approaches and the integration of child labour eradication efforts within landscape approaches with a different (e.g. ecological) focus.

General aims:

- Shed light on child labour components in landscape approaches and discuss learnings around the designing and implementation of specific child labour-focused approaches and the integration of child labour eradication efforts within broader landscape management initiatives
- Promote collaborative, territorial and cross-sectoral approaches to tackle child labour
- Provide opportunities for the exchange and sharing of experiences around the integration of measures to combat child labour into (existing and foreseen) landscape approaches
