

SHORT DESCRIPTION

PRO-PLANTEURS is a joint project of the German Initiative on Sustainable Cocoa together with the German government and the Ivorian government. PRO-PLANTEURS aims to professionalize cocoa-producing family-owned-businesses and their farmer organizations in five regions of the southern and eastern parts of Côte d'Ivoire. The objective is to improve the families' livelihoods by increasing their incomes and improving a balanced nutrition.

One objective of the project is, in particular, to provide women with opportunities to improve their income situation and create a better nutritional basis for their families, thus creating a positive impact on their living conditions. In addition, the project contributes to making cocoa production more attractive again to young cocoa farmers, allowing them to earn a regular income from producing cocoa.

After the successful completion of the first phase, PRO-PLANTEURS entered a five-year follow-up phase in June 2020 (6/2020-5/2025). In total, PRO-PLANTEURS will reach 30,000 cocoa farmers and their cooperatives.

STRENGTHENING FARMER ORGANIZATIONS

PRO-PLANTEURS (Phase I) has already professionalized 35 cooperatives. 160 managers of cooperatives were trained for their management function and further coached. 17 regional workshops specifically on financial education and competitiveness were held.



“The entire management and especially the accounting of our organization faced serious problems. We even had not had any accountant. After been trained by PRO-PLANTEURS our board recognized the importance of employing an accountant with a proper office room and of sharing all data available on our business. Today, our cooperative has its own accountant. He was employed with the assent of our board. “



PRO-PLANTEURS supports the farmer organizations through professionalization. In targeted training courses and accompanying coaching they learn how to improve their administration and the services they offer to their farmers.

Women are encouraged to take on more responsibility within the cooperatives, for example by forming Comités des Femmes to represent their interests. Through them, more women are to be motivated to leading roles.



PRO-PLANTEURS encourages sustainable cocoa cultivation. The project supports male and female cocoa farmers through direct consulting and trainings in Good Agricultural Practices (GAP). These measures aim to increase sustainably productivity and to improve the quality of cocoa beans by the means of suitable fertilizers and selected plant materials. To improve their harvest fields and the quality of the cocoa, farmers are trained in Farmer Field Schools. Farmer Business Schools train farmers in better management of their farm businesses and cultivation systems.



“I didn’t know how to run a business. Thanks to PRO-PLANTEURS I understood that I am the manager of my plantation. Now I manage my expenses and revenues. I was even able to save, and therefore to invest. In order to increase my income, I also grow other crops.”

IMPROVED COCOA PRODUCTION

PRO-PLANTEURS has trained 5,500 cocoa farmers in GAP. 7,700 farmers are educated in operational management. 12,400 cocoa farmers were sensitized to agroforestry. 48,000 shade trees were planted on 1,600 hectares of land.



PRO-PLANTEURS IS WORKING ON FOUR COMPONENTS – PROGRESS UP TO DATE

PRO-PLANTEURS works with 2,100 women splitted into 16 women's groups in income-generating activities. 76 rural advisors have been trained. 22,700 households have been sensitized in improved nutrition. 12,500 households have been trained in diversification.

“Thanks to PRO-PLANTEURS, our women's group was able to install a grinder and refiner machine, to transform manioc into attiéké. Because of the activity we can work and support our family and the village. Our vision is to build a kindergarten in our village Abouédé.”

IMPROVING NUTRITION THROUGH DIVERSIFICATION

PRO-PLANTEURS promotes diversification. Women play a major role in improving living conditions, especially for the children. The approach is to diversify cultivation to improve income and nutrition. To this end, the women are supported in activities such as the production, processing and marketing of other agricultural products apart from cocoa. A second focus is on overcoming food shortages and year-round food security.



PRO-PLANTEURS uses an integrated approach to disseminate best practices and success stories. PRO-PLANTEURS fosters the exchange between the cooperatives and other project participants. Dialogue and learning platforms allow them to jointly reflect and further develop. PRO-PLANTEURS builds upon the existing national platforms.

PRO-PLANTEURS – OBJECTIVE

The objective of PRO-PLANTEURS is **to improve the living conditions of cocoa farmers and their families** in the project region by **increasing income** and **improving nutrition** and **conserving natural resources**. The members of the German Initiative on Sustainable Cocoa are involved in the implementation of PRO-PLANTEURS. They participate in the steering and the technical committee on site and are organized in Germany in a project working group.

The project progress is regularly reflected upon and adjusted if necessary. The impact of the measures implemented by PRO-PLANTEURS is monitored based on defined indicators.



PRO-PLANTEURS II (06/2020-05/2025) REACHES 30.000 COCOA FARMERS AND THEIR ORGANIZATIONS

Due to the success of the project PRO-PLANTEURS was transferred to a five-year follow-up phase.
